IAHFi has been active in planning fundraisers with the intention of using some of the proceeds to

The process has already begun with the highly successful Wine and Food Tasting event that was held on April 27th to enhance our children’s Summer Camp. For its next fundraiser IAHFI will present an exciting musical concert on Sunday October, 21st to be held at the TROY MUSIC HALL featuring direct from Italy the magnificent voice of tenor, David Righeschi. Many more cultural and informative presentations are being planned



for the future.

Local producers and craftsmen will rent space to sell an array of locally grown fresh produce and handmade foods and products. When Jeanette was 16 years old, she worked in a local bakery and learned the fundamentals of baking and cake decorating. At that time, she enjoyed the experience and the creativity that baking provided and decided to pursue a career in the culinary arts. Born in Niskayuna, Jeanette grew up in Loudonville and graduated from Shaker High School. She then attended Paul Smith's College in Lake Placid where she graduated with a degree in culinary arts. Upon graduation, she moved to New Hampshire for a year where she worked as a pastry chef. Returning to the Capital District, Jeanette obtained a position at Cowan and Lobel where she worked for 6 years, beginning as a cake decorator and advancing to the position of general manager. 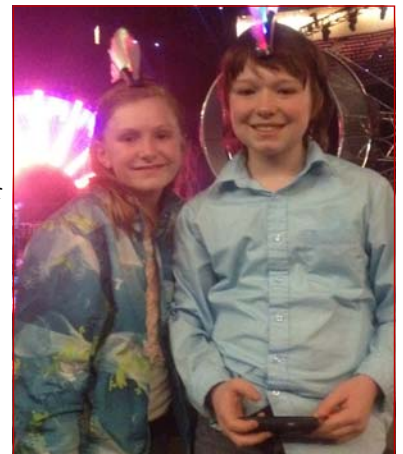

When Jeanette first entered Paul Smith's College and started a career as a pastry chef, she never envisioned herself ending up in a managerial position, using her creativity in a different capacity. As she often says to young culinary graduates, "Keep dreaming and keep options open. You never know where you'll end up." Jeanette Bowers is not through "ending up". She is still progressing and developing. It will be a pleasure to follow the future adventures of this creative, talented, hard-working woman.

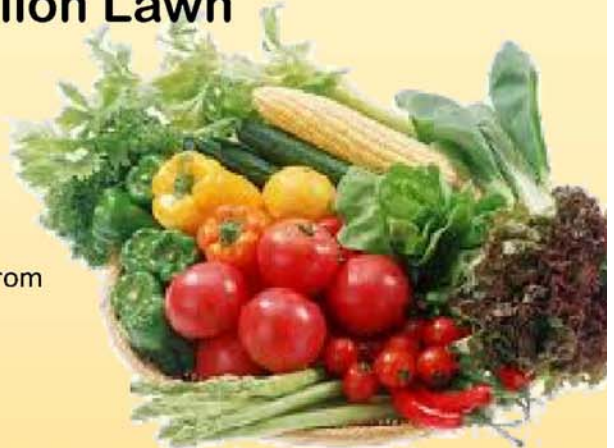

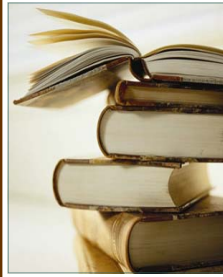

Watermelon Granita-Filled Lime Cups

These mini melon look-alikes will delight your guests!

Ingredients

12 halves limes (reserve 2 tablespoons juice)
1 cup sugar
2 cups water
4 cups watermelon cubes
1/2 cup currants or raisins
1 piece crushed ice (optional)

Instructions

To make lime cups: Cut limes in half lengthwise; cut around pulp of each half with sharp knife, leaving peel intact. Scoop out pulp, using spoon to loosen pulp from peel and reserve 2 tablespoons lime juice for granita. Set lime cups aside. Stir together sugar and water in small saucepan; heat to boiling. Cool slightly. Place watermelon in container of food processor; pulse to puree watermelon. Place colander over bowl; pour pureed watermelon into colander to strain out seeds, forcing watermelon through with back of spoon, if needed. Stir reserved lime juice and cooled sugar mixture into pureed watermelon. Pour into 13x9x2-inch pan; freeze until firm, about 4 hours. To serve, scrape frozen watermelon mixture with spoon to make granita. Stir in currants for seeds. Mound granita in lime cup. Serve on bed of crushed ice.
