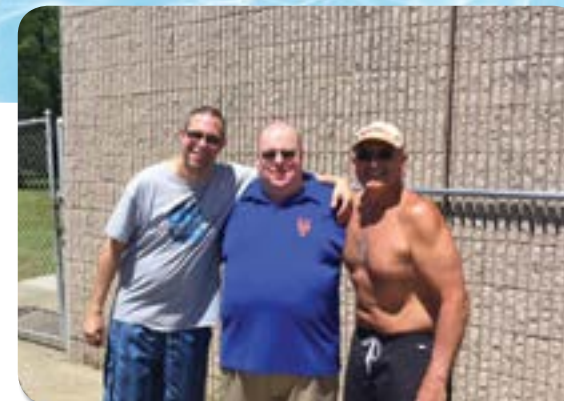
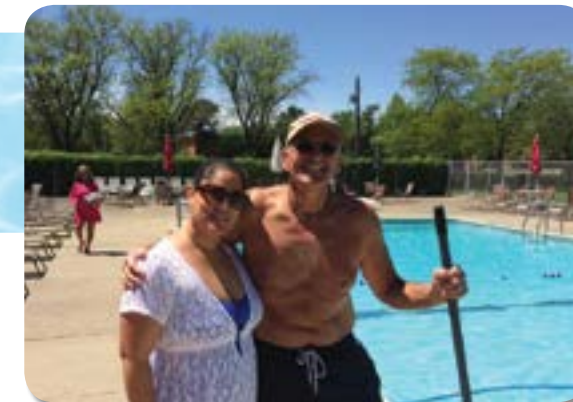

FINDING OUR *Immigrant Ancestry*

The source of most micro-films of Sicilian and Italian records is the *Latter Day Saints* (LDS, Mormon) church. A great many of those records are on line at <https://www.familysearch.org> (FamilySearch), with more being continually added. The subscription site www.ancestry.com (Ancestry) presents some of the same records in a somewhat different search format. Both FamilySearch and Ancestry have recently been discussed here. A relatively new free site that has been adding records for numerous provinces in Italy and Sicily is <http://www.antenati.san.beniculturali.it/> hereafter called the *Antenati* site.

'Antenati' means 'ancestors' in Italian, and the site is in the Italian language, but options to use English are being added. Learning a few simple Italian words and phrases can help in using the site. Below is an explanation of the categories of records on the site. Other on-line venues show records from the same sources, but do not identify the sources. There are three:

1. The **Stato Civile Napoleonico** (Napoleonic Civil Status): contains records from around 1806 through 1815, the period of Napoleon Bonaparte's dominance in Europe. These records from the North of present-day Italy reflect the diversity of the several



duchies and city-states that comprised the region before there was a country called 'Italy'. Because of that diversity, although the records follow a more or less consistent 'Napoleonic' format, there are differences in appearance between records from each region. For example, records for *Venezia* (Venice) are mostly handwritten and quite detailed, while those for *Firenze* (Florence) are on pre-printed forms, but with much less information.

Regions to the south, which were part of the *Kingdom of Sicily*, were not under Napoleon's control. There, uniform, pre-printed forms were used from *Abruzzo* south, extending to most of *Calabria*. Those forms also used the Napoleonic format, probably because of its ingenuity. Provinces on the *island*

of Sicily (insular Sicily), although obviously part of the *Kingdom of Sicily*, did not have civil records for this period.

2. The **Stato civile della Restaurazione** (Civil Status of nations and states on the Apennine peninsula, prior to the existence of the nation 'Italy'): covers the period 1816 to approximately 1860 - 1865. The northern records still reflect the diversity of the separate states, and often church records still were the only ones. In 1816, for political reasons, the *Kingdom of Sicily* became the *Kingdom of the Two Sicilies*, still comprising the regions from *Abruzzo* south, including insular Sicily. For 1816 - 1819, the southern regions (excluding insular Sicily) used the same forms as for the years 1806 - 1815. In 1820, new pre-

printed forms were introduced in the Two Sicilies. Birth records were 'split', with civil data on the left and note about baptism on the right. Civil matrimonial records were effectively marriage 'contracts'. The left side gave details: the betrothed, their parents, acknowledgement of marriage banns, etc., but was not a 'marriage record'. The right side acknowledged that the couple had been wed, and gave the marriage date. The actual marriage record, with much less detail, was recorded and archived by the *church*.

3. The **Stato civile italiano** (Italian Civil Status): covers records of the new kingdom of Italy. From 1860 - 1865 these retained the previous, pre-printed 'split' forms. Relations between church and state were fractured by the '*risorgimento*', and from 1866 - 1874, forms were handwritten, with no mention of the church sacraments. In 1875 new pre-printed forms without church references were instituted, and were continually in use until 1910. They're easier to read, but generally give fewer details than earlier records.

For some regions, the category *Inventario* (Inventory) is also listed.

This is not a compilation of actual records, but a schedule of where (register, file, volume, etc.) the paper records can be found. The *Antenati* site presents a vast collection, and explaining its access and use will require more than one column.

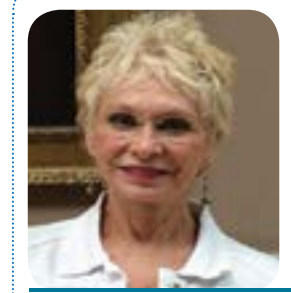
