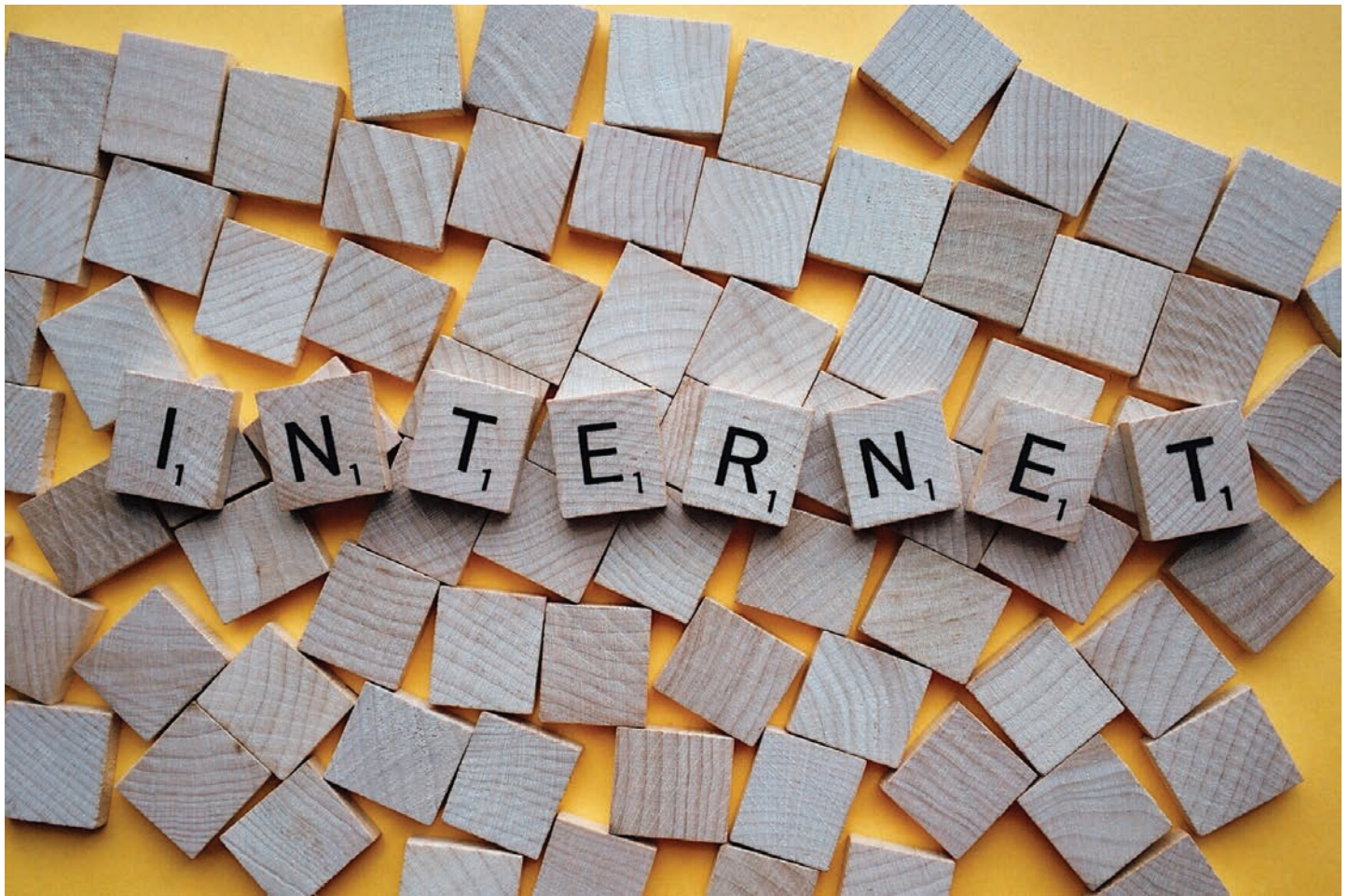

SICILIAN AND ITALIAN CIVIL RECORDS *on* FAMILYSEARCH

FamilySearch refers to the website <https://www.familysearch.org>.

I have discussed the on-line records available there. Because the site is constantly added to, and I want to compare it to other on-line sources, I'll reprise here, with additional information. To date, the preponderance of these on-line records are certain years' civil records for selected towns. Eventually, the Mormon's entire cache of microfilmed records, civil and church, will be available on line.

To view a town's records on FamilySearch, enter the site and sign in. At the top, select "Search", then

"Catalog." A box will come up headed "Place." Enter the name of the town. Several options may appear; select the one that matches your town and province of interest, and press the blue "SEARCH" button at the bottom. If records of civil actions are available for your town, you'll see something like "Italy, [your Province name], [your Town name] – Civil Registration." Click there, and you'll see the name of one or more collections for that town. Pick the one you want. You'll get a list of available microfilms, and if records for your town are on line, you'll see the name of the town and province at the top of the page and the message in

red: "Records of Italy, [Province name], Civil Registration (Tribunale) are available online, *click here.*" You may click there, or scroll down to see a list of the records available. The records for each option are generally the same, but may be arranged differently. Below is the procedure to follow if you select the first option, and "click here."

Although you've already searched by town, you'll see a page naming the province, and the link "View Images in This Collection – Browse through [a number of] images." Click that, and

you'll see a list of 'Comune o Frazione' (Towns or Neighborhoods). Click on the name of your town. You'll see a list of types of records for given years, generally from 1820 through 1910: 'Nati' (Births); 'Allegati' (Attachments); 'Cittadinanze' (Changes of Address); 'Pubblicazioni' (Marriage Banns); 'Matrimoni' (Marriages); and 'Morti' (Deaths). Each line in the list will have one or more icons: a *reel* (available on microfilm); a *camera* (records are on line); or a *magnifying glass* (records are indexed and may be searched for by a person's name). If only the *reel* icon shows, the records are available only on microfilms, to be rented and viewed at a *FamilySearch Center*.


The on-line records on FamilySearch are images of the microfilms, and must be 'scrolled' through, like viewing the records on a microfilm reader. Civil records are kept chronologically, with an index of the year's records following each year. When searching, the index at the end of a year will give the 'Numero di Ordine', or record number of a particular record. Then the images of the records themselves may be accessed. They are displayed on line by 'image numbers' that do *not* match the page numbers in the original register, nor the numbers of the records themselves. Family search presents 'thumbnails' of the images which can

be scrolled through quickly, then enlarged to see the full image. The record numbers are at the top of the record, in script, Arabic numerals or both (e.g. 'Numero tredici 13').

A drawback of the FamilySearch system is that once the records are accessed, the location of each annual index must be found by trial and error. When the name of interest is found in an index, you must note the image number of the index and the *Numero di Ordine* of the record, and then scroll back to find the image of the record of interest. After 1875, civil records were on pre-printed forms: birth records are shown three records per *FamilySearch* image, marriages are two records per image, and deaths are four records per image, so you can estimate how many images forward or back you must go from a given image number, to find the record number you want. Between about 1866 and 1874, the records were completely handwritten, so the number of records per image may vary from those in more recent years. Prior to 1866, birth records are shown one per image, marriage contracts comprise two to four images, and deaths are one record per image. When you find the one you want, make a note of the image number for future reference and include it in your documentation of the record's source. If you need more records from the

same year, go back to the yearly index (whose image number you had wisely recorded).

FamilySearch allows searching for the record of a specific individual by name. On the "Catalog" page discussed above, rather than searching by "Place", enter a name in the blocks for "Deceased Ancestor's Name." Be forewarned that this may return 'too much information.' You may see numerous persons of the same name listed, who may not be your ancestor, with various types of listings, not only records from Sicily or Italy. Since many original Sicilian/Italian records haven't yet been indexed, you may have to revert to searching for them as described above. In either case, for some towns, you may see a message stating that the records may be viewed only at a Mormon *FamilySearch Center*.

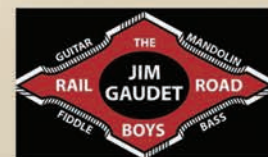

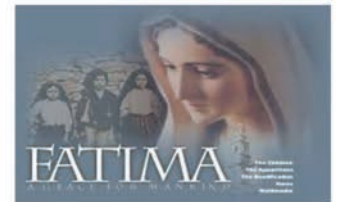

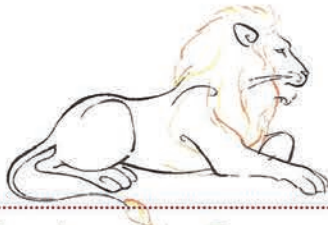
