## Member Profile Diane Allegretta Biernacki By Anna Acconi

## And She Keeps On Going

There is much about Diane Allegretta Biernacki that is memorable, beginning with her birthdate on November 11, 1944, Armistice Day. Diane, an only child, grew up in the Second Avenue section of Albany and has many memories of an exciting and wonderful young life. She recalls dressing up to go downtown to shop at Meyer's and Whitney's, swinging on the green double swings in Washington Park while smelling the aroma of freshly made popcorn coming from the popcorn vendor and looking for the peanut man on the corner of State and Pearl Streets.



Diane's career in business began at an early age when, as a high school student, she worked in the sewing department at W.T.Grant's and, as a summer job, worked at City Hall Vital Statistics. Upon graduation, Diane worked at McKesson and Robbins, a drug company on Broadway. Soon after graduation, when Diane was 19, she married the "love of her life", Freddy Biernacki, whom she had dated since they were 14.

Freddy was a builder and believed in moving into a new house every five years. After living in Guilderland, Voorheesville and other towns in the area, Diane finds herself in her current house from where she can view the backyard of her first house with Freddy. Freddy and Diane had a philosophy about children. They wanted to have them in their 20's, raise them in their 30's and kiss them goodbye in their 40's. Of course, life doesn't always follow formulas and Diane's life has always been filled with the love of children and grandchildren. Her children, Cheryl, Michael and Jason, have given her 4 beautiful grandchildren, Ashley, Emily, Adam and Michael. Her family, including her wonderful daughters-in-law, Dawn and Shara, keep her energized and involved in activities that include go-carting, horse shows, baseball and dance.

When Diane returned to the workforce as her children grew older, she obtained a position as an aid in the Bethlehem School District. She left that to work in the Post Office in Slingerlands where she remained for 11 years before she retired. Did I say retired? Actually, Diane doesn't know the meaning of the word. After leaving the Post Office, she bought the Empire Travel Agency in Guilderland and, after selling that, went into the real estate business where she has remained for the past 22 years. Diane is an associate broker with Realty U.S.A. and also works part time as a library clerk at the Voorheesville Public Library.

Diane and Freddy joined the IACC in 1980 and remained active members. Freddy helped build the pavilion and donated picnic tables; Diane served as co-president of Woman's League where, to this day, she has been an active member and volunteer.

In 2004, Diane lost her love, Freddy, but has kept her life a full one. She indulges in two of her passions, travel and the study of history. Since considering herself semi-retired, Diane has traveled extensively to many countries, including Italy, Holland, France, Greece and Egypt. Her next trip, in February, will include a stay in New Orleans and a cruise to the west Caribbean. Diane, a member of the Albany Historical Society and the Shaker Society, plans one day, should she ever really retire, to become very active in these organizations. She already is working on ideas.

Diane is one of those people who will never grow old because she is always open to new ideas and to new adventures. She continues to inspire others with her love of work, friends and family and her indefatigable ability to enjoy it all.



## A Few Famous Italians

#### Enzo Ferrari

The sacred monster of the motoring world! Enzo Ferrar, also called "The Commendatore" was a famous Italian car driver and entrepreneur, the founder of the Scuderia Ferrari Grand Prix motor racing team and of the Ferrari car manufacturer.

#### Enrico Fermi

Nobel laureate (1938) and scientific luminary Enrico Fermi (September, 1901- November, 1954) was an Italian pioneering nuclear physicist whose works on the development of the first nuclear reactor, and for his contributions to the development of quantum theory, nuclear and particle physics, and statistical mechanics were numerous, profound, and lasting. He is being considered one of the greatest scientists of the 20th century.

#### Leonardo Da Vinci

Leonardo Da Vinci is the archetypal Renaissance Man representing the humanistic values of that period in his art, science and writing. He is celebrated as the most diversely talented person ever to have lived! He was more than an artist, he was an Italian polymath, a scientist, mathematician, engineer, inventor, anatomist, painter, sculptor, architect, botanist, musician, astronomer and writer. His insatiable curiosity and intuitive sense were beyond any limits! Works like Mona Lisa and The Supper occupy unique positions being considered the most famous and the most reproduced.

#### **Cristopher Columbus**

Also called the Admiral of the Ocean Sea, Columbus (1451 - 1506) remains a figure who has been variously characterized as one of the greatest mariners in history, a visionary genius, a hero, colonizer, a naive entrepreneur whose voyages across the Atlantic Ocean led to general European awareness of the American continents

#### Carla Bruni

Born in Turin, Carla is a famous former supermodel, songwriter, singer and her fame increased even more after becoming the First Lady of France. The actual wife of the French President Nicolas Sarkozy was among the 20 highest-paid fashion models.

#### Alessandro Volta

Can you imagine your life without batteries or electricity? The Italian physicist (1745-1827) is worldwide known for the development of the first electric cell, back in the 1800's. He discovered the first practical method for generate electricity. Constructed of alternating discs of zinc and copper, with pieces of cardboard soaked in brine between the metals, the voltic pile produced electrical current.

#### Andrea Bocelli

If God had a singing voice, he would sound like Andrea Bocelli! Andrea Bocelli, also called "the fourth tenor", was a disciple of Luciano Pavarotti and Zucchero Fornaciari. The blind, Tuscany-born vocalist has emerged as one of the most magnificent voices in contemporary opera.

#### Giacomo Casanova

Italy certainly has a reputation for romance! And who can be called "the world's greatest lover" if not an Italian? Giacomo Casanova de Seingalt (1725 - 1798) was a Venetian adventurer and writer. Famous as a veritable womanizer, his name remains synonymous with the art of seduction. His main book Histoire de ma vie (Story of My Life) is regarded as an intimate portrait of the manners and European social life in the 18th century.

#### Dante Alighieri

"Il sommo Poeta", "The Supreme poet" or "The father of the Italian language" are references to the one and only Durante degli Alighieri, (1265 – September 14, 1321), commonly known as Dante, the Florentine poet of Middle Ages. His magnum opus, the epic poem Divina Commedia is considered a masterpiece of world literature.

#### Giorgio Armani

Italy with its unique sense of style and fashion has long led the development and revolution of haute couture. Well-known for defining trends and setting couture standards, the glamorous world of fashion is incomplete without mentioning the name of the Italian fashion icon Giorgio Armani.



9" pie plate

2 cups all purpose flour

1 cup Crisco

1/4 cup iced water

Place Crisco and flour in a food processor and pulse until all is combined. If you do not use a food processor, cut Crisco into flour until combined. It must look like it is ready to roll out. Disregard the usual instruction of combining it until it looks like crumbs. Add water all at once and push water into dough thoroughly with a fork. Dough will be wet. Slather a good amount of flour on a pastry cloth. Cover rolling pin with a pastry sleeve. Divide dough in half. Place half in center of pastry cloth. Dip heel of hand in flour and gently press dough until it has a round shape. Roll out dough in short strokes being careful not to roll the edges too thin. I do not use the handles of the rolling pin. I run my hand back and forth in the middle of the rolling pin. Roll out to 10". Roll crust around rolling pin and roll out onto pie plate. Fill with your favorite filling and repeat for top crust.
